#### News from the classes...

#### **Foxes and Owls**

We have had such a jam-packed term! We have loved our topic 'Was it a disaster?' where we have researched coalmining throughout history and how Measham and surrounding areas were affected by different acts in history. We have learnt lots about the conditions and jobs in coal mining and are very happy to discuss all of their findings on this – so much so that we have used this information in our computing to work on our PowerPoint skills. In our Science lessons we have been investigating forces and how they affect the world around us. We have enjoyed our PE this half term, continuing building on our gymnastic skills and starting our hockey lessons. We've been able to practise new techniques and incorporate these into mini games.

Year 5 and 6 were also so excited to be able to show their parents all of their new skills that they have been working so hard on in music lessons. The different skills are, correct holding position, plucking individual strings, strumming in pattern, learning new chords C, F, Am and G7. The Year 5's started off with some of the warm up exercises we learn including 'My Dog has Fleas' and some chord practice; they then went on to demonstrate their use of chords in a song 'Best Day of my Life' where they handed the ukuleles to Year 6. Year 6 then played 2 more tracks showing further chord progression. All of the staff and parents were so proud of how much they have learned and the skills they have acquired. Well Done!
